We are pleased to share the South Dakota Arts Council's FY 2019 annual report with you. Within it, you will find a complete listing of grants awarded to South Dakota organizations, schools and individuals as well as information about our programs, mission, values and goals. Throughout this report, you'll see photos and facts highlighting the impact Arts Council programs and funding makes in South Dakota.

Our grant awards are determined through a competitive application and review process. Applications include a description and plan for the proposed project; a budget outlining the use of funds and the source of required matching funds; and documented evidence that the plan is achievable.

Applications are reviewed by panels of experts including representatives from all across South Dakota as well as one out-of-state expert on each panel. Panelists read all applications assigned. They score and provide comments on them independently then meet via conference call to discuss. Projects may be recommended for full, partial, or no funding, and panelists must reach an agreement on that recommendation. Funding recommendations are forwarded to the 11-member, governor-appointed advisory board to the South Dakota Arts Council, which reviews and approves final recommendations.

We are called to fairly serve and represent all South Dakotans as stewards of the public trust. The South Dakota Arts Council is mindful of taxpayers' dollars that advance the arts in South Dakota and takes seriously this great responsibility.

In State Fiscal Year 2019 the Arts Council awarded 448 grants totaling about \$1.3 million to artists, arts institutions, schools, and other nonprofit organizations throughout the state, a number representing about 76% of the Council's near-\$1.7 million budget. South Dakota Arts Council sponsored programs included 13,000 artists and reached an audience of more than 1.3 million people, including nearly 310,000 youth.

These grants helped generate \$27.64 million in local spending to carry out supported projects — a \$21 to \$1 return on every public dollar invested in the arts in South Dakota communities. Additionally, the nonprofit arts leverage significant amounts of event-related spending by their audiences. Cultural audiences spend an average of \$31.47 per event, per person, excluding the cost of admission. These expenses may include meals, lodging, transportation, childcare, souvenirs, and other items.

As you read through this annual report, you will discover the diverse impact South Dakota Arts Council programs and partners have on our state's quality of life, cultural tourism and economic development. Thank you for your past and continued support.

SOUTH DAKOTA ARTS COUNCIL

The South Dakota Arts Council is structured administratively as a state agency within the Department of Tourism. The agency is advised by an 11-member board, appointed by the Governor, which meets regularly to recommend grant awards and otherwise promote and advance the arts across the state.

The South Dakota Arts Council receives support from the State of South Dakota, through the Department of Tourism, and the National Endowment for the Arts, a federal agency. State funds are generated by a portion of the state tourism promotion tax.

53 YEARS OF SERVICE

Established in 1966 and funded by the State Legislature and the National Endowment for the Arts, the South Dakota Arts Council is a state agency serving South Dakotans and their communities through the arts. The Council is the advisory board to the SDAC staff within the Department of Tourism. Council members are appointed by the Governor.

The South Dakota Arts Council was created to unify and coordinate the development of the arts across the state through public service, arts education programs, access and inclusion, cultural tourism, grants and services, and to act as the steward of the state's federal appropriation from the National Endowment for the Arts.

ENABLING LEGISLATION

INTRODUCTION TO SOUTH DAKOTA CODIFIED LAWS 1-22

1966 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

The South Dakota Legislature, being aware of the impact of culture on a stable economy, desires to stimulate, encourage, and give recognition and assistance to the arts which, in order to grow and flourish, depend upon freedom, imagination and individual initiative. While the development of the arts has long been considered a matter of local concern, there is a need to unify and coordinate these forces on a statewide basis. The arts, the creative spirit which motivates them and which they personify, are an essential part of the state's human resources.

The best interest of the state and its people requires that artistic expression in all of its forms be disseminated for everyone to see, appreciate and enjoy in order for our cultural and economic progress to be sustained and given impetus. There is created a South Dakota Arts Council composed of eleven members appointed by the Governor.

PURPOSE

Recognizing the importance of creativity in the lives of all South Dakotans, the Council makes quality arts accessible throughout the state by providing encouragement, grants, services and information to artists, arts organizations, schools and the public. The Council strives to ensure access to the arts and educational arts opportunities as part of lifelong learning in South Dakota.

VISION

Our vision is to transform South Dakota's communities and people through the arts. We see deeper public awareness broadening appreciation for the fine arts; better arts education reviving school environments; wider access to the arts fostering understanding among cultures; and artists and arts organizations enhancing the quality of life for all South Dakotans.

VALUES

To accomplish its mission and support its vision, the Arts Council is guided by a strategic plan informed by input from constituents throughout the state and grounded in public values.

We believe:

- Greater public awareness of the value of the arts fosters sustained public and private support.
- Arts education stimulates creativity, communication, and lifelong learning.
- Universal access to the arts is intrinsic to the well-being of all South Dakotans.
- Artists are central to the creative environment of South Dakota.
- Arts organizations contribute to vibrant, progressive communities.
- The arts play an essential role in cultural tourism.

GOALS

As we strive for more equitable approaches at the South Dakota Arts Council, we are led by three driving forces: Learn, Connect, Progress.

Learn Goals:

- 1) K-12 Arts Education: Work to improve access to and inclusion of arts education in K-12 schools.
- Workforce Development: Promote youth participation in the arts to develop skills and careers. Motivate and support artists and arts businesses to flourish in our state.
- Professional Development: Provide and support continuing professional development opportunities to artists and arts leaders throughout South Dakota.

Connect Goals:

- Resources and Information: Develop regular, ongoing methods for artists, organizations, and communities to access information and resources to support their needs in the arts.
- Outreach and Technical Assistance: Increase efforts to include the voices of all South Dakotans and improve access to staff or other professionals to assist in individual and community efforts to advance the arts.
- Cooperation: Advance shared goals through partnerships with other state agencies, private entities, and the business community.

Progress Goals:

- Community Development: Foster strong communities locally and statewide with a sense of place that is creative and beneficial to all.
- The Essential Arts: Clearly and effectively communicate the importance of the arts in education, community livability, and the economy to policy-makers and stakeholders throughout South Dakota.

RURAL COMMUNITIES GET A BOOST FROM THE ARTS

Arts and culture rejuvenation efforts are proving positive economic and quality-of-life outcomes in small towns across South Dakota. Our agency assists with these efforts through project grants, artists-in-residence, touring events, and support to rural arts organizations serving their communities. Research shows how rural arts organizations make a difference:

- Rural arts organizations draw nonlocal audiences at higher rates than urban arts organizations. When it comes to arts events in rural areas, 31 percent of audience members travel "beyond a reasonable distance" vs. 19 percent who travel to urban areas.
- Rural counties that are home to performing arts organizations experienced population growth 3 times higher than rural counties without these organizations.
- Rural counties that house performing arts organizations provide residents with higher incomes (up to \$6,000 higher on average) than those without these organizations.
- 2 out of 3 rural businesses report that arts and entertainment are important for attracting and retaining workers.
- Businesses that value the arts are more likely to report an expanding market for their products and services.



In FY2019, the Arts Council:

- Awarded direct grant funds in 106 South Dakota communities.
- SDAC programs, grants, and services were utilized in 60 counties across our state.

Arts Education

EDUCATION PROGRAMS HELP STUDENTS EXCEL

The South Dakota Arts Council helps advance learning for students of all ages through a variety of programs, grants, and services. Our arts education programs are especially important to rural communities where access to arts teachers and arts classes is limited, or often nonexistent.

ARTISTS IN SCHOOLS & COMMUNITIES:

Through Artists in Schools & Communities professional teaching artist residencies, we funded 213 weeks of arts courses at 78 sites across South Dakota including schools, healthcare institutions, and community arts and service organizations. These residency classes enrolled 11,361 youth and 7,384 adults.

POETRY OUT LOUD:

This national poetry education program and recitation competition is sponsored by the National Endowment for the Arts and the Poetry Foundation and carried out by state arts agencies in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and Puerto Rico. In FY2019, 20 schools and more than 1,000 students participated in Poetry Out Loud. Our state champion, Gage Gramlick, a student at Lincoln High School in Sioux Falls, went to Washington, D.C., to represent South Dakota, where he made it to the final round, placing in the top nine in the nation and winning \$1,000.

EDUCATOR GRANTS:

Assisted eight educators with classroom arts education projects and professional development.

ARTS EDUCATION ISN'T JUST FOR KIDS!

Professional development opportunities such as the Arts Education Institute provide recertification, graduate, and undergraduate credit opportunities at an extremely low cost to teachers.

Though the majority of our artist-in-residence activities serve youth, we're also seeing the value of this program in serving adults. Residencies at the Michael J. Fitzmaurice South Dakota Veterans Home, the Sanford Cancer Center, the South Dakota Human Services Center, and other facilities housing elderly or ill people use the residency program to help improve the quality of life for their residents and patients. Art making decreases boredom, lifts spirits, and gives people something to enjoy for a little while each day.

Touring Arts

The South Dakota Arts Council's Touring Artists use their grant funds to offer discounted performances and workshops to South Dakota nonprofits in every corner of the state.

In Fiscal Year 2019, SDAC supported 196 touring arts events in 70 different communities. These events reached a collective audience of 43,424 youth and 47,408 adults, directly benefiting 709 artists.
